The Course Introduction: The contemporary poetry course will introduce students to modern Anglophone poetry, with special emphasis on modern American and British poetry. It aims to read and discuss a variety of poetry written in the last 50 years. We explore a range of poetry in terms of theme, style and viewpoints.

The Objectives of the Course: Understanding the way poetic form contributes to meaning; recognizing the ways in which poetry is contextualized at a particular point in time, appreciating the use of poetic devices such as imagery and the use of rhythm and rhyme.
